

AMONG THOSE WHO LIVE IN STATES WHERE MEDICINAL MARIJUANA IS LEGAL (N=721),

AWARENESS OF RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION



AMONG THOSE WHO LIVE IN STATES WHERE MARIJUANA IS ILLEGAL (N=396), 81% knew marijuana was illegal in their state

AMONG THOSE WHO LIVE IN STATES WHERE MARIJUANA IS LEGAL (N=425),

KNEW MARIJUANA USE WAS LEGAL WHERE THEY LIVE

AMONG THOSE WHO LIVE IN STATES WHERE MARIJUANA IS DECRIMINALIZED (N=188),



58% OF AMERICANS SAY ALCOHOL IS MORE HARMFUL TO A PERSON'S HEALTH THAN MARIJUANA

4% SAY MARIJUANA IS MORE HARMFUL THAN ALCOHOL AND 34% SAY THEY ARE EQUALLY HARMFUL; 3% SAY NEITHER ARE HARMFUL.

Interviews for this study were conducted on the SSRS Opinion Panel Omnibus from April 1 - 4 2022, among a nationally representative sample of 1,009 respondents age 18 and older. The margin of error for total respondents is +/-3.60 percentage points at the 95% confidence level and the design effect is 1.36.

The SSRS Opinion Panel Omnibus is a multi-client, probability-based survey that fields twice a month. It delivers a nationally representative sample of 1,000 adults age 18 or older in English (with Spanish language option). Data collection is conducted online and via phone (for non-internet and web reluctant respondents) using the probability based SSRS Opinion Panel.
